Stop being fooled by scammers!

They sound so convincing on the phone, but their agenda is to bleed you dry! This summer the FTC and its federal and state law enforcement partners announced a new program called Operation Stop Scam Calls, ftc.gov/tsr. This is a joint effort to fight against illegal robocalls. Here's how you can help:



- Know your rights. A robocall trying to sell you something is illegal unless the company has your written permission to call you.
- Spot the scams that use illegal robocalls. Many robocalls lead to scams because they try to convince you they are from a government agency, tech support, or warranty company, or that you have won a prize but you need to pay for it first.
- When you get a robocall, hang up! It's a scam! Never call back, don't press any number to get off their list or to call back. Just hang up!

If you need more information or advice on how to stop these intrusive calls, check out ftc.gov/calls.
